

SUN CITY WALLS - 2017 in Review

In 2017 many Sun City perimeter walls were repainted. To the SCRAP Committee it seems it has been forever since this project began; looking back the first wall was repainted in May, 2016 which is only 19 months ago.

With continued financial support, we hope to see the last wall with a new coat of paint completed by the end of 2018. The Committee plans to be as aggressive in 2018 as it was in 2017.

Some of the walls that have been painted are:

- Bell from the east end of Sun City to the west end
- Beardsley from 99th to the east end of Sun City
- Union Hills from 104th to east end of Sun City
- Lindgren from 99th east to Conestoga
- Boswell Highwood to the Willow Creek golf course
- 99th from Beardsley south to Grand
- 99th Avenue from Grand south to Riviera
- Alabama from 99th east to Sun Valley Drive
- 101st from Grand south to Coggins
- 101st from Augusta to Alabama
- Olive from 99th to 103rd

There has been much interest and involvement from the community, not only donating funds for the project, but from many residents also volunteering their time. Time has been spent caulking cracks, applying sealer needed for the paint to bond to the surface, as well as brushing and rolling paint on many of the walls. Employees of APS and Wells Fargo Bank joined this community project as well as four women from the Philippines, Japan and Solomon Islands assisted one Saturday working on a wall!

however, there are several miles remaining in need of a fresh coat of paint. It is estimated \$60,000 will be needed to complete the painting of the walls. Once the funds are secured, the goal is to complete the painting in 2018.
